

## Economic & Market News

#### This Week:

- U.S. reports scheduled to be released this week include ISM manufacturing and services indexes, factory orders, productivity and employment statistics.
- Non U.S. reports scheduled to be released this week include inflation, factory orders, retail sales and the unemployment rate in Germany, inflation, retail sales and the unemployment rate in the E.U. and the unemployment rate and consumer confidence in Japan.

#### Week in Review:

- Personal income in the U.S. increased 10% monthover-month in January after a 0.6% increase in December. Market expectations were for a 9.5% month-over-month increase.
- Durable goods orders in the U.S. increased 3.4% month-over-month in January. Market expectations were for a 1.1% month-over-month increase.
- The Ifo business climate indicator in Germany increased to 92.4 in February from 90.3 in January. Market expectations were for a reading of 90.5.
- Economic sentiment in the E.U. increased from 91.5 in January to 93.4 in February. Market expectations were for a reading of 92.0.
- China's NBS manufacturing PMI fell from 51.3 in January to 50.6 in February. Market expectations were for a reading of 51.1.


